Tom Jones (Book & Lyrics) and Harvey Schmidt (Music) wrote The Fantasticks for a summer theatre at Barnard College. After its Off-Broadway opening in 1960, it went on to become the longest-running production in American theatre history and one of the most frequently produced musicals in the world. It is currently running in a successful revival in New York. Their first Broadway show, 110 in the Shade, was successfully revived a few years ago. I Do! I Do!, their two-character musical starring Mary Martin and Robert Preston, was a success on Broadway and is frequently done around the world. For several years, Schmidt worked privately at their theatre workshop, lones and concentrating on small-scale musicals in new and, often, untried forms. In 1998, The Show Goes On, a revue of their songs starring themselves, was presented at York Theatre, and Mirette, based on the award-winning children's book. premiered at Goodspeed Opera House. In addition to an Obie and a 1992 special Tony for The Fantasticks, their "stars" were added in 1999 to the Off-Broadway Walk of Fame outside the Lortel Theatre.



The building which houses The Genesian Theatre Company was originally St John's Church, and dates from 1868. It has served as both a church and a poor school until 1932 when it became the Kursaal Theatre, housing the Sydney Repertory Company. In 1938 it became the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company which was formed in 1944.
