


DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Venice is a glitzy, technicoloured and delirious city. Its wild glitz is both unreal and familiar. Lovers clamber through windows and suitors flaunt their ridiculous talents. The city sings and scats to the pace of frenetic jazz solo.

This jubilant city is slowly rotting.

The Merchant of Venice is an undeniably controversial play. The vile racism of the Venetians and their hatred of Shylock has historically been a difficult aspect of the play to reconcile.

The beauty of Shakespeare comes from his complex treatment of his characters. There are no clear heroes or villains in our sinking Venice. To say otherwise would be to ignore the carefully crafted ambiguities that make The Merchant of Venice resonating and timeless.

At times we can laugh and be swept away by the charismatic lovers and touched by the warmth of the young Venetians and, in the same breath, be dismayed at their prejudice and cruelty. The only constant is the wealth and decadence that provides a distraction to the crumbling society.

We are, however, just as proud of the hundreds of talented amateur actors, directors, designers, lighting and sound specialists who have contributed to Sydney's unique little theatre over the years.


Over the years the company has developed into a group providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six or seven main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.

Membership of the company is open to all people over the age of eighteen.

The building that houses The Genesian Theatre Company was originally St John the Evangelist Church and dates from 1868. It has served as both a church and a poor school until 1932 when it became the Kursaal Theatre, housing the Sydney Repertory Company. In 1938 it became the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company, which was formed in 1944.
