## Timothy M Carter - Musical Director

Tim's credits as Musical Director include the Sydney premier of Andrew Lloyd Webber's By Jeeves, Spamalot, Little Shop of Horrors, Let's Hope and The Western Show. An experienced musician and composer, he has written music for productions of The Glass Menagerie, Saint Joan, Charlie's Aunt, The Living, A Chaste Maid in Cheapside and a devised production based on a suite of his compositions called FRAGMENTS. Tim is also an acclaimed Lighting Designer, and his studies include a Bachelor of Creative Arts (Music Composition), Master of Creative Arts (Theatre Production) and a Master of Creative Arts - Research (Theatre Production).

## Choreographer: Debbie Smith

For the GTC, Debbie has directed Journey's End, And Then There Were None, Cards on the Table, Enchanted April, Shadowlands and Coward at Christmas. She Assistant Directed on Northanger Abbey and Money and Friends and choreographed for Dickens Down Under, By Jeeves and Northanger Abbey. Starchild is her third collaboration with Roger. She has also designed sets for numerous plays including Hay Fever, Intent to Murder, Journey's End and Private Lives. She is currently on the Board of the GTC and will co-direct Frankenstein for the GTC in 2014.

## A note from the Authors:

Welcome to a 'World Premiere' 16 years on!! Nick and I teamed up to adapt Oscar Wilde's The Star Child when we were both working for West End theatre company Stoll Moss in 1996. The show was work-shopped in London and later in Sydney with casts including actors who went on to feature in The Bill and Eastenders; and even one who turned into a yellow Wiggle! However, largely because of the composer and lyricist being on opposite sides of the world the show itself spent most of the last 16 years in a bottom drawer!
We are enormously glad therefore that the 'Stars' have finally aligned for this belated world premiere and hugely grateful to the Genesian Theatre and our stellar cast and crew and to all those who participated in the process of bringing this new musical to the stage. RG

## Roger Gimblett (book \& lyrics)

Roger's previous musicals include Flowers at Breakfast Fortune Theatre NZ (1994), What Santa Does other Days of the Year Fortune Theatre NZ (1996)/SIT NZ (2009), Pete and Hook (Madhatter musicals). He has recently completed the workshop of a new musical Haunted written with Timothy Carter. His one act plays Three Chairs! Decline and Hall, Horizons and Tant Pis have been variously performed by theatre groups in Australia, the UK, South Africa and India. Roger adapted Great Expectations and Term of His Natural Life for the Genesian Theatre.

## Nicholas Edwards (music)

Nick studied music education at the University of Melbourne, before taking degrees in theology and psychology, and gaining post-graduate qualifications in psychotherapy in London. He grew up in Australia, where he studied piano, voice and tuba. On moving to the UK he initially worked as a professional tenor - firstly at Wells Cathedral, then in other parts of England. He has also worked in non-creative roles with several London theatres and Opera Australia. His first co-written full musical was staged in his final year at school. Other co-written musicals include two adaptations of Oscar Wilde works - Star Child and Dorian Gray. The University of Melbourne Institute of Education staged his full-length musical Conspiracy Indeed! for which he wrote the music, book and lyrics, and directed the music. His latest show, Teach Me a Lesson, is inspired by Tom Brown's School Day'.
Nick's choral music has been commissioned, performed and recorded in Australia, UK and USA and he was composer-in-residence - working with the choirs and ensembles of the Athens First United Methodist Church, in Georgia, USA. He lives in London.


## BEN BENNETT - The Star Child

Born in England Ben migrated to Queensland with his family when he was 5 years old and subsequently received a scholarship to attend Sydney's McDonald College of Performing Arts. He has played lead roles in both plays and musicals and in 2012 was a Top 6 finalist on Channel 9's first season of the hit TV show The Voice. During 2013 Ben made regular TV appearances on the children's game show Pyramid and was honoured to receive the inaugural Showbiz International Future Prospect Award as part of the Rob Guest Endowment. Other recent performances have included Romeo in Romeo \& Juliet, a Luna Park TVC, Carnival of Venice Opera at Canberra Albert Hall and a lead in the short Film Give. Performances at charity events include Steve Waugh Foundation at Sydney Cricket Ground (live streamed to the UK) and Miss World Australia 2013. Ben composes and records his own songs, plays both guitar and piano and is an active member of the Sydney music scene.


## ELIZABETH MACGREGOR - The Beggar Woman

Elizabeth has played numerous principal roles in both musicals and operetta, including Buttercup (HMS Pinafore), Florence (Chess), Victor/Victoria (Victor/Victoria) and Gabby/Bobbi (City of Angels). This is her fourth production with Genesian, having appeared in Richard III, Dangerous Corner and Witness for the Prosecution. Elizabeth is thrilled to be involved in the premiere of a new musical, and, when not on a stage, she can be found gardening or flailing her arms wildly in a flamenco class.


## ROBERT GREEN - The Leper

When not practicing law Robert is a cabaret singer. This is his third show with Genesians. In January 2014 he makes his Melbourne debut at the Midsumma Festival in a Noel Coward cabaret. Robert always says: Singing is what I do when I am lost for words!

Amanda completed the Summer Musical Theatre Workshop at Circle in the Square Theatre School, NYC. She also holds a BA (Hons) in Vocal Pedagogy and Radio Documentary. Previous stage credits include the Golden Girls Puppet Tribute Show, The Roomsical and Sense and Sensibility.


## TIMOTHY BENNETT - Headmaster/Chief Minister

About the Genesian Theatre

The Genesian Theatre Company is a non-professional group operating from an historic church in Kent Street in the heart of the Sydney CBD. We boast among our alumni numerous household names in Australian theatre and film such as Bryan Brown, Baz Luhrmann, Judi Farr, and John Bell. We are, however, just as proud of the hundreds of talented amateur actors, directors, designers, lighting and sound specialists who have contributed to Sydney's unique little theatre over the years.

Over the years the company has developed into a group providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six or seven main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.

Membership of the company is open to all people over the age of eighteen.

Originally constructed in 1868 as the Church of St. John the Evangelist served as both church and poor school until 1927. The school was operated by the Sisters of St. Joseph and was visited on many occasions by Mother Mary MacKillop now St. Mary of the Cross. In 1932 it was converted into the Kursaal Theatre and later, from 1938, was the first site of the Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of the Genesian Theatre which was formed in 1944.
