The play has two acts with an interval of 15 minutes.

David Williamson & Money and Friends

David Williamson is one of Australia's most accomplished and successful playwrights. With over 40 plays to his credit since his first major commercial successes in the 1970s; his witty, satirical plays have dominated our national stages with their sharp and often hilarious portrayals of the middle classes foibles and obsessions.

Money and Friends is the second Williamson play to be produced by the Genesian Theatre; proceeded by the successful 2010 production of *Dead White Males. Money and Friends* was first performed in 1992 and was a major commercial success for both the Sydney and Melbourne Theatre companies. It is now a staple of the community and independent theatre repertoire. Written in the aftermath of the 1989 share market crash, it's just as fresh and relevant today, as we emerge from the 2008 Global Financial Crisis.

The Director – Peter Lavelle

This is Peter's first outing as director of a major Genesian Theatre production. Last year for the Genesians, he directed a workshop production of Michael Gow's *Europe* and his play *Fox on the Run* was directed by Maggie Smith. Previously directorial experiences include the 2012 Sydney Short and Sweet Festival, and his own play *Lipstick on a Gorilla* was performed at the Stables Theatre in 2002. He has written television scripts for the Channel 7 drama series *A Country Practice* and had three radio drama scripts produced by ABC radio. Peter was trained and practises as both a doctor and a journalist.

Shane has been a member of the GTC for 15 years. In that time she has been involved in over 30 productions as an actor or director. Her most recent appearances were as Dottie Otway in *Noises Off* and Mrs Boyle in *The Mousetrap*. She last directed *The Adventures of a Bear called Paddington* in 2011 and will direct *Charleys Aunt* later this season.

Michael Hurley



Michael's theatre training stems from his association with Macquarie University. He has worked in classic productions like *The Iceman Cometh* and *The Merchant of Venice*. He has a broad interest in theatre, including 20th century American plays and Shakespeare.

Gemma Munro



Previously for Lane Cove Theatre Co, Gemma has starred in *Up For Grabs, Move Over Mrs Markham, Treasure Island* and *Hansel & Gretel,* directed *Secret Bridesmaids Business* and musical director for *Snow White.* Gemma has also appeared in Woodstock productions and has a long history with Orange Theatre Company performing in over 11 shows including 42nd St, Follies, Little Shop of Horrors, The Crucible and Dimboola.



The Genesian Theatre Company is a non-professional group operating from an historic church in Kent Street in the heart of the Sydney CBD. We boast among our alumni numerous household names in Australian theatre and film such as Bryan Brown, Baz Luhrmann, Judi Farr, and John Bell. We are, however, just as proud of the hundreds of talented amateur actors, directors, designers, lighting and sound specialists who have contributed to Sydney's unique little theatre over the years.

Over the years the company has developed into a group providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six or seven main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.

Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company, which was formed in 1944.
